THE DAY OF PENTECOST: WHITSUNDAY

FIRST READING: ACTS 2:1-21

Comment: "Filled with the Spirit"

This lesson tells the story of the Holy Spirit filling the apostles and empowering them to share the message of the gospel with people of different languages. Clearly this was a most dramatic moment in the life of the early church, an experience described in terms of wind and fire. From this time forward the mighty works of God done in Jesus will be told to all the peoples of the earth, crossing barriers of language and culture.

Psalm: 104:24-34, 35B

The psalm describes the wonders of the world created and renewed by the Lord's Spirit.

SECOND READING (The Epistle): Romans 8:22-27

Comment: "Praying with the Spirit"

In this New Testament reading the Apostle Paul understands the whole of creation to be linked with human destiny as we await our redemption. We await our adoption in hope, dependent on the indwelling Spirit of God who intercedes for us in all things in ways we cannot achieve for ourselves.

THE HOLY GOSPEL John 15:26-27, 16:4B-15

Comment: "Christ sends the Spirit of truth"

In our Gospel Jesus tells his disciples that his going away will mean the coming of the Advocate, the Holy Spirit who will guide them into all truth. The Counsellor-Spirit will bring true judgement into the world. Everything the Spirit declares will have been received from Jesus, even as all which the Father has belongs to Jesus. The spirit, then, reveals Jesus who himself has made the Father known.

Dr. Sands, visiting at the 9'clock service is a lecturer in Systematic Theology at Codrington College and his wife is a student. Congratulations to Dr. Sands who recently celebrated his 50th anniversary of ordination as a Deacon in the Church of God. He, along with Canon Knight was ordained in this Cathedral on May 1, 1968.

DIOCESAN NEWS

1. Barbados Diocesan Synod: The Electoral Assembly which reconvened on Monday, May 14, 2018 in the Ivan Harewood Centre, Christ Church Parish Church remained deadlocked. Neither Fr. John Rogers nor Dean Jeffrey Gibson secured the required two-thirds majority in both the House of Clergy and the House of Laity at the same time, in any of the three ballots which were cast. The meeting was adjourned. A date for another session will be announced in due course; in the meantime, let's continue to offer prayers for the Synod to discern the one whom God wants to become the 14th Bishop of the Diocese of Barbados.

2. Anniversary Service: The Barbados Diocesan Altar Servers Association (B.D.A.S.A.) will be holding its Annual Whit Monday Service at St. Lucy Parish Church on Monday, 21st May, 2018 with preparation at 9:30 A.M. followed by procession, Solemn Mass and Sermon.

3. Eleven Plus Retreat: The youth department will be hosting a weekend retreat for students who sat the 2018 Common Entrance Examination. Its focus will be to bring "awareness of the challenges and changes our children will be facing, and to assist in this transition and reinforce positive values which should lead to positive change as they take this next step".

The retreat will be held at St. Clements Church Centre, St. Lucy from June 29th to July 1st. Cost - \$60 per student. Churches are encouraged where possible to sponsor their students. Deadline for applications is June 4th. Registration forms are available.
