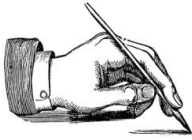

From The Dean's Pen

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

In the recently concluded General Election, all the parties, as well as those who offered themselves as independent candidates, indicated their desire to serve the country.

It is against that backdrop that I have penned my message today, and commend to everyone's consideration, the excellent example of Jesus, the embodiment of service. He challenged his followers to do the same (Mark 10:32-45). Many were impressed with his miraculous deeds; he was celebrated as a great miracle-worker, and some, James and John, even wanted to share in his glory. His own sacrificial service was presented as a model for the brothers and all disciples, **"For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many."** (10:45).

Personal ambition and patronage did not start with James and John, nor did they end with them. In fact, similar attitudes remain alive and both church and state are exposed to this twin scourge today. However, Jesus calls us to a different ethic. If service is the basis of one's participation in public life, there is an underlying ethic of surrender and sacrifice; God honours service rather than power. He challenges us to practice living by Kingdom Rules in this world.

It is the model which the Christian Church and individual Christians need to embrace. It is one which is hereby commended to our newly elected and installed government. I end with the prayer of St. Ignatius of Loyola.

**Teach us, good Lord,
to serve you as you deserve,
to give and not to count the cost,
to fight and not to heed the wounds,
to toil and not to seek for rest,**

**to labour and not to ask for any reward,
save that of knowing that we do your will. Amen.**

**THE SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST
YEAR B**

First Lesson: 1 Samuel 3:1-10 (11-20)

Comments: “The calling of Samuel”

In our Hebrew scripture lesson, we hear how **Samuel learns that it is the Lord who is calling him**. Three times the boy Samuel misunderstands and thinks that it is his mentor Eli summoning him during the night. Finally, Eli realizes it must be the Lord, and tells Samuel to be ready for the prophetic word which will be spoken to him.

Psalm 139:1-6, 13-18

With marvellous wisdom, God alone perceives the heights and depths of life.

Second Lesson: (The Epistle) 2 Corinthians 4:5-12

Comments: “Treasure in clay jars”

In this lesson, **Paul teaches that although human weakness is all too apparent in those who preach the gospel, what is proclaimed is the glorious light of the revelation of God in Jesus Christ**. The same divine light which first shone at the creation has now been manifested in Jesus. Human frailty becomes the means for God to prove that God is the source of the power of the Gospel. Paul’s sufferings and mortality are a way of sharing in the weakness and death in which Jesus himself participated. Yet through perseverance, they point beyond themselves to the source of life greater than death.

The Gospel: Mark 2:23-3:6

Comments: “Doing the work of God on the Sabbath”

In our Gospel, **Jesus proclaims in word and sign that the Son of Man is sovereign over the Sabbath law**. The interpretation of the Torah prevailing during this period regarded both the plucking of grain and healing to be forms of work, and therefore activities forbidden on the Sabbath day. Jesus, however, teaches that human need and the doing of good must always take precedence over rigid interpretation, for “the Sabbath was made for humankind, and not humankind for the Sabbath.” Many Jewish teachers of the time agreed that the Sabbath must always be seen as a blessing for human life and not as an arbitrary requirement.

Jesus goes beyond this in announcing that he possesses an even greater authority for human behaviour in the law.

DIOCESAN NEWS

1. Barbados Diocesan Synod: The Electoral Assembly which reconvened on Monday, May 14, 2018 in the Ivan Harewood Centre, Christ Church Parish Church remained deadlocked. Neither Fr. John Rogers nor Dean Jeffrey Gibson secured the required two-thirds majority in both the House of Clergy and the House of Laity at the same time, in any of the three ballots which were cast. The meeting was adjourned until Thursday, June 7, 2018 at 5:30 P. M. In the meantime, let's continue to offer prayers for the Synod to discern the one whom God wants to become the 14th Bishop of the Diocese of Barbados.

2. Annual Diocesan Synod: The Annual Session of the Barbados Diocesan Synod will be held on Wednesday, June 13, 2018. The Session will commence with a celebration of the Holy Eucharist at Christ Church Parish Church at 9:30 A.M. This will be followed by the Business Session in The Ivan Harewood Centre.

3. Eleven-Plus Retreat: The youth department will be hosting a weekend retreat for students who sat the 2018 Common Entrance Examination. Its focus will be to bring ***“awareness of the challenges and changes our children will be facing, and to assist in this transition and reinforce positive values which should lead to positive change as they take this next step.”***

The retreat will be held at St. Clements Church Centre, St. Lucy from **June 29th to July 1st**. Cost - \$60 per student. Churches are encouraged where possible to sponsor their students. Deadline for applications is June 4th. Registration forms are available.

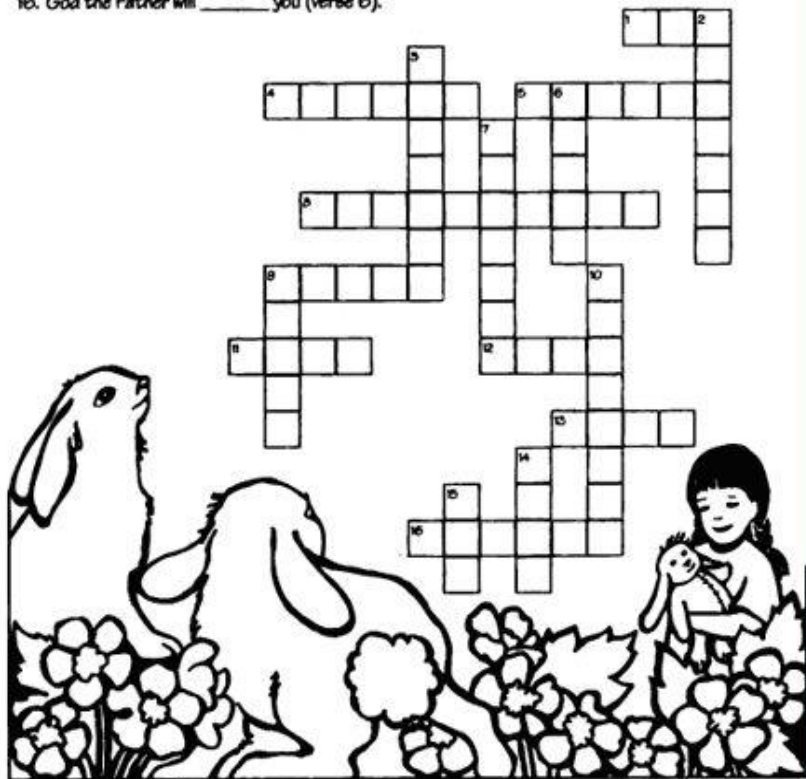
