#### My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

The twin miracles of the healing of a woman with a life-long hemorrhage and the raising of Jairus' daughter showcase the need for faith at all times, but more especially when medical help seems elusive: Mark 5:21-43.

Jesus felt the touch of the woman in her desperation and he heard the cry of a religious and civil leader in society. In each case, there was a touch; symbolic of Jesus' desire to overturn the taboos of his era. The touch of a Rabbi by a woman would have been out of order and for a religious leader to touch a dead body, he would have been rendered unclean. Nevertheless, the touch proved to be the means through which the power to heal and to restore was transmitted. To both, Jesus brought life and did so gladly. Obviously physical life was the primary object of Jesus' concern; however, in the context, the woman's saving faith also enabled her to claim an even richer life with God.

These scenes served to reassure the faithful of Mark's community of their hope in the resurrection to eternal life, through Christ. Through the years, these familiar encounters have also served to shape the minds of believers in Christ. Perhaps, in our time, they can help to affirm the relationship between medicine and faith; they are not to be seen as opposed to each other.

Meantime, if one enjoys good health, one should be grateful to God and see it as a gift to be treasured. But if there is poor health, there is no need to despair; one can take comfort in the fact that one can reach out and receive God's gift of wholeness. Let everyone, therefore, work for the joyful celebration of life.

## THE SIXTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST YEAR B

First Lesson: 2 Samuel 1:1, 17-27

Comments: "Lamentation over Saul and Jonathan"

In our Hebrew Scripture reading, the report of Israel's devastating defeat by the Philistines at Mount Gilboa is brought to David at Ziklag. Saul and his three sons have been slain, including Jonathan. David might have been expected to show relief at the death of Saul, who had so relentlessly haunted him, but instead David grieves both publicly and privately. Israel has lost her king and finest prince to war, and David, who served Saul so long and loved Jonathan, is bereft. David's elegy was likely set to music, extolling Saul's heroism, Jonathan's might in battle, and the profound national and personal loss embodied in their deaths.

#### Psalm 130

A plea for mercy offered in patient hope to the faithful Lord.

Second Lesson: (The Epistle) 2 Corinthians 8:7-15

Comments: "Excel in generosity, following Jesus"

In this New Testament lesson, the Apostle Paul encourages the Corinthians to be generous in their contributions to a collection he has been gathering for the relief of the Church in Jerusalem. It seems the Corinthians had begun to raise money for this cause in the previous year but had not completed the project, despite the means available to them. In sharing from their abundance with those in need, these new disciples will be following in the way of the Lord Jesus, who, though rich, became poor that the Corinthians might become rich.

The Gospel: Mark 5:21-43

Comments: "Christ heals a woman and Jairus' daughter"

The Gospel tells of the healing of a woman with hemorrhages and of the daughter of Jairus, an official of the local synagogue. Here are two remarkable stories of healing, one told within the other. As Jesus is responding to Jairus' plea for his sick daughter, a woman who has suffered with hemorrhage for twelve years reach reaches out in faith, and is healed and given new life. By the time Jesus reaches Jairus' house, the twelve-year-old

daughter is seemingly dead, but Jesus raises her to new life.

The Cycle of Readings for the Daily Office affords persons the opportunity to read significant portions of Scripture throughout the year. Please see Proper 8, Year 2, page 762; for example, tomorrow, Monday, the readings for Morning Prayer are: Psalm 106:1-18, Numbers 22:1-21, and Matthew 21:12-22; at Evening Prayer, Psalm 106:19-48. 1 Samuel 10:17-27, and Romans 6:12-23. 
