My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

Grace and peace to you in the name of Jesus, the Good Shepherd. In the Gospel of John, Jesus demonstrated his care and concern for people as he preached, taught and healed many; and restored their brokenness. He stated,

"I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. (John 10:14-15)

This model of leadership has been commended to the church. A 'shepherd-leader' builds relationships of trust and care; leading, guarding and nurturing people to wholeness. This shepherding task is not exclusively that of the clergy; it is a model that can inspire leaders in all sectors of society. Certainly, that was the case when the prophet Ezekiel prophesied to the community during the Babylonian exile; he denounced the pre-exilic kings as false shepherds and asserted that Yahweh would take over the shepherding role directly (Ezekiel 34:15-16).

At a time when many have expressed concern about the level of violence and restlessness across the country, the restoration of the social and moral fabric of the society can be the focus of our thoughts and prayers this Lent. In that regard, 'shepherding – leadership' could be considered. It would require the involvement of everyone: pastors and people; civic leaders and citizens; caring for each other.

May the Good Shepherd make us whole, as we observe the disciplines of the season.

#### The Last Sunday after the Epiphany

First Reading: Exodus 34:29-35

Comment: "Moses' face shone"

In our first reading we hear how **Moses' face shone after he had spoken with the Lord.** When Moses came down from Mount Sinai after again receiving the ten commandments, the people were afraid to approach him because of the radiance of his face. Whenever he talked with the people, he had to wear a veil.

#### Psalm 99

The holy and mighty Lord reigns on high. God spoke to Israel's leaders from a pillar of cloud and has forgiven them their misdeeds.

Second Lesson: (The Epistle) 2 Corinthians 3:12-4:2

Comment: "We will be transformed"

In our New Testament reading Paul celebrates the freedom and boldness that comes to believers through Christ. Moses veiled his face when leaving the Lord's presence, but now the veil is removed and open access is given to God in Jesus. The Spirit brings transformation through God's mercy, therefore right conduct and transparency are to characterise the dealings of God's people, commending themselves to all with clear conscience.

The Holy Gospel: Luke 9:28-36

Comment: "Jesus is transfigured on the mountain"

Our Gospel is **the story of Jesus' transfiguration.** The narrative is richly woven with themes and symbols drawn from Israel's past and its hopes for the future. Moses and Elijah represent the law and the prophets whose promises Jesus fulfils. While Jesus is praying, divine glory is reflected in his human person. The chosen disciples hear a voice from the cloud declaring that this is God's beloved Son.

#### **DIOCESAN NEWS**

During Lent 2019, our Diocese will follow an Introspection Programme entitled "God's Call To 'Newal". It has been inspired by Bishop Maxwell's Enthronement sermon, in which, among other things, he called the church to return to God and a return to service. The term 'newal' is a play on the word renewal and 'new all' in Christ 'making all things new' and also it being a 'new day'.

Within this Lenten programme of "God's Call To 'Newal", our church family will be invited over the six Sundays of Lent and Easter Sunday to examine (what are to be referred to as) the seven Cs according to the outline below:

- 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Lent Chosen selected by God for God's mission
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Lent *Conversion* change of mind, submission to God's call and new focus
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Lent *Commission* sent on the new mission/mandate
- 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent *Communion* fellow workers, shared ministry, team support
- 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent *Conversation* giving testimony of new life in Christ
- Palm Sunday Commitment dedication of heart despite the cost and cross
- Easter Sunday *Celebration -* rejoicing in the new life and transformation

This will also serve as the theme for the Clergy Ministerial Introspection Day on Monday, March 4<sup>th</sup>, 2019, at 10 o'clock in the Ivan Harewood Centre, Christ Church. Please prayer for the guidance of the Holy Spirit upon the bishop and other Clergy as they gather, in preparation for Lent.
