THE SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

First Reading: Acts 16:9-15

Comment: *"Lydia and her household are baptised"*

In this reading from the story of the early church, **Paul and his companions are called by a vision to journey to Macedonia and the city of Philippi, where a merchant named Lydia responds to the gospel and is baptised, together with her household.** She offers her home to the travellers and becomes an important supporter of their missionary endeavour.

Psalm 67

A prayer for God's graciousness and saving power, and a bidding of praise by all people for God's justice and bounty.

SECOND READING (The Epistle): Revelation 21:10,
22-22:5

Comment: *"The Lamb is the light of God's City."*

In this reading, **John the Seer presents a vision of the new Jerusalem, the paradise of God.** The city has no need of a temple or a sun or moon, for it is enlightened by the very glory of God and the lamp of the Lamb, who is Jesus. It will be a place of purity and abundance for the saints. As in the Garden of Eden, here will be found the river and the tree of life.

THE HOLY GOSPEL: John 14:23-29

Comment: *"The Father will send the Holy Spirit."*

Our Gospel tells of **Jesus' promise to his disciples of the coming of the Holy Spirit.** Although Jesus will no longer be present physically, those who continue in his love will know his abiding presence, together with that of the Father. The Holy Spirit will be their counsellor and bring Jesus' own words to mind. Jesus shares these things with his followers before they take place, and he gives them his peace.
