The Tenth Sunday after Pentecost

First Reading: Isaiah 5:1-7

Comment: "The vineyard destroyed"

In our opening lesson, the prophet sings a sad parable about God's vineyard, Israel, and the destruction which must now come upon it. Despite all God's loving care, this vineyard brought forth only sour grapes. The Lord looked for right judgement and found wrong. God hoped for justice and instead heard cries of distress.

Psalm 80:1-2, 8-18

A lament and a plea to the Lord, the shepherd of Israel, that the Lord will restore God's ravaged vineyard.

SECOND READING (The Epistle): Hebrews 11:29-12:2

Comment: "The faith of the Hebrew people"

In the New Testament lesson, Jesus the promised one has opened access to the Father in ways previous generations longed to see. The righteous men and women of former days performed all their deeds in faith, true to God and to such revelation as they had received. Now disciples are to set aside distractions and surmount every obstacle, encouraged by the witness of the faithful ancestors and walking confidently in the way forged by Jesus through the sacrifice of the cross.

THE HOLY GOSPEL: Luke 12:49-56

Comment: "Jesus brings fire on earth"

In our Gospel passage, Jesus foresees difficult times ahead: his own ordeal and the necessity of division even within families. He has come to bring the purifying fire of judgement, and must himself first undergo the baptism of suffering and death. Before there is any peace on earth, hard decisions leading to ruptures have to be made. The people should be like good weather-watchers in reading the signs of the times.

CATHEDRAL NEWS

Organ Restoration Fund: Since 2012 a report was received from NICHOLSON & CO (WORCESTER), Pipe Organ Builders 1841, which detailed the dire state of various parts of the Cathedral's 1924 Pipe Organ: "the sheepskin leather used in both the key mechanism and the wind system, the organ blower", and the general condition of the instrument. A decision was taken recently to start the fund-raising to meet this need and an Organ Restoration Committee, under the chairmanship of Canon George Knight, has been established. There is a plan to recruit 50 individuals, who would each recruit 9 other persons to join in raising \$10,000.00 per team, towards the goal of \$500,000.00 by December 2020. A total of \$18,002.31 has been collected so far, and a performance chart has been placed on the Notice Boards.

Concert Tickets: A Festival Concert, in support of the Organ Restoration will be held at the Cathedral on Sunday, September 29, 2019 at 6 p.m. Tickets are available at \$30 each from members of the Organ Restoration Committee, the Covenanters and the Parochial Church Councilors. Members are asked to sell at least five tickets each to assist in the promotion of this event. Meanwhile, a chart has been posted on the notice boards highlighting the target and the progress to date, in this fund-raising project. The cooperation of everyone is invited.

Window Fund: Members are asked to note that there has been a delay in the implementation of the plan to proceed with the replacement of the windows. Meanwhile, sincere thanks to all who have contributed to this fund, so far. A total of \$13,090.00 has been collected to date and we invite your ongoing contribution towards this fund.
