The Eighth Sunday after Pentecost: Emancipation Sunday

First Reading: Exodus 14:21-31

Comments: *"Deliverance at the Red Sea"*

This reading is, **the story of the deliverance of Israel from**

bondage in Egypt. The people are terrified when they see the pursuing army and complain that it would have been better to live in slavery than to die in the wilderness. Moses urges them to have courage, for they will see the salvation of the Lord, who has called them to freedom to serve the one true God. The Lord then brings them safely through the sea and destroys the army of the Egyptians.

The Second Lesson: (The Epistle) Galatians 3:23-29

Comments: *“Clothed with Christ in Baptism”*

In this New Testament lesson, we hear that **the era of domination by the law is passed. Through faith all find themselves baptized into a unity in Christ.** Formerly we were like small children who had to be closely watched. Now, through God’s justification, we are given the status of young adults coming into their maturity. Whatever the former barriers of race. Class, or gender, we are together heirs of the promise to Abraham.

The Holy Gospel: Luke 4:16-21

Comments: *“Jesus the Liberator”*

In our Gospel reading, **Jesus returns to Galilee and enters the synagogue in Nazareth. Here he gives what has been called his inaugural sermon.** He reads from the book of the prophet Isaiah. These words offer hope and good news to the poor, and tell of healing and freedom for the oppressed. This time, Jesus says, has begun.
