My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

Grace and peace to you in the name of Christ.

Advent, among other things, helps us to celebrate time. "Its time has come"; is an expression which suggests that a new product or project has come on the scene after a period of conceptualization, design, and incubation. At the right moment, like a foetus lying in the womb, its image has been revealed.

In a sense there is some kind of continuity in history when one considers the past, present, and future; it is somewhat similar to the Biblical view of time. However, our view of time is not the same as the Biblical view. According to Eugene H. Maly, Advent helps us to celebrate at least two aspects of that difference.

Firstly, the modern world tends to view time as a kind of 'clothesline', stretching from creation to the end. On this line the events of history are hung like various items of clothing. In that regard time is separate from history and events, although it is the necessary support for them. Secondly, in the Bible, history attains its continuity from God's self; and

there is usually a connection between past and future events. The present anticipates the future event, the latter far exceeding the former in intensity.

In the Church, Advent is the celebration of the Christ who has come and who will come, again. History is, therefore, moving in that constant direction and is not just a combination of separate and distinct events, whether pleasant or disturbing. Believers in Christ have no need to fear, because, Christ is near. God is in the midst and with that consciousness, believers find the capacity to cope.

The reason is an equally strong faith in the past, a belief in what God has already done to prove His love. The reasoning is that, if God has done a lot for the people already, He has much more in store for us as an Advent people.

Let us live out the Advent hope, daily.

THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT YEAR

First Lesson: Isaiah 2:1-5

Comments: "War transformed into peace"

In our lesson from the Hebrew Bible the prophet Isaiah sets forth a majestic vision of a time when people throughout the world will worship the Lord and live in peace with one another. The mountain of the city of Jerusalem will be raised up to become a symbol of hope and justice to every nation. Many peoples will look to Jerusalem and to its holy Mount Zion as the place from which God will issue God's word and law, bringing about an end to strife and warfare.

Psalm 122

"A pilgrim's song of praise and prayer for the peace of Jerusalem."

Second Lesson: (The Epistle) Romans 13:11-14

Comments: "Salvation is here: wake from sleep"

In this reading, **Paul urges a way of life in full awareness of the nearness of salvation.** Disciples must recognise that the nighttime of sinfulness is passing. The daytime, the time for new conduct and the following of Jesus, now comes.

The Gospel: Matthew 24:36-44

Comments: "The sudden coming of salvation"

In our Gospel lesson, Jesus tells his disciples of the need for readiness because the Son of Man will come at a day and hour which no-one knows. People will continue to go about their usual affairs, when suddenly this time of judgement will happen. Disciples are to be ever watchful, imagining themselves like a householder whose alertness could prevent a robbery.

3.Advent: The New Church Year commences today, Advent Sunday. The Sunday Lectionary is Year A, and may be found on page 669; the Weekday Eucharistic Lectionary Year II, page 707; and the Daily Office Lectionary, Year II on page 736; all in the Book of Common Prayer, CPWI. The dominant Liturgical colour used in the Cathedral is Blue, with Pink on the Third Sunday of the season.

4. Lectors and Intercessors: Members who read lessons and lead Intercessions are invited to a meeting on Tuesday, 3rd December 2019 at 5:30 p.m. in the Cathedral. The purpose of the meeting is to establish an independent ministry for the further enhancement of individuals and a framework for the development of it as a ministry of Proclamation.

5. Blue Christmas Service: Next Sunday, the Cathedral will host a Blue Christmas Service. Anyone who experienced a bereavement during the year and for whom this would be the first Christmas without their loved ones, are invited to attend. The service is designed to offer comfort and hope at Christmas time; and to affirm the presence of God as revealed in Christ, in the midst of grief.


