THE NATIVITY OF OUR LORD CHRISTMAS DAY

First Reading: Isaiah 52:7-10

Comment: "Heralds announce God's salvation"

The Hebrew scripture lection heralds a time of great joy as the Lord saves the people and brings deliverance to Jerusalem. The long exile is at an end. The messenger proclaims the good news, "The Lord reigns." The watchmen of the city respond with shouts of triumph to see God's salvation.

Psalm 98

A song of thanksgiving and praise to the victorious Lord, who has made righteousness know and shown faithfulness to God's people.

Second Lesson: (The Epistle) Hebrews 1:1-12

Comment: "God has spoken by a son"

In this lesson the Letter to the Hebrews begins with a declaration of Jesus' sonship. He is far above all angels at the right hand of God. Previously God had spoken through the prophets, but now the will God is expressed in the Son, through whom the world was created and who bears the stamp of divine being. After making purification for sins, he has taken his seat of greatest honour.

THE HOLY GOSPEL: John 1:1-14

Comment: "The Word became flesh."

The gospel opens with a hymn to the expression of God's very being, God's Word, who has now become flesh and lived among us. Through the Word all things have their life. The Word is the light of all humankind, and was witnessed to by John the Baptist. Although the world made by the Word did not recognize the Word, those who believe in the Word have been given the right to become the children of God.

BISHOP'S CHRISTMAS MESSAGE FOR **DECEMBER 25TH, 2019**

(To Be Shared with Congregations on Christmas Day)

Dear Saints in Christ,

It is a great joy to greet you on this blessed Christmas day. Today we officially begin the joyful season of glorifying God for His great act in history, that of taking flesh upon Himself, in the person of His Son Jesus Christ, and dwelling among us as our liberator and reconciler in order to regather us as citizens of His Kingdom.

I think it is absolutely marvellous that we celebrate this Christmas season at a time when we are winding down and naturally reviewing the year that has been spent and prayerfully preparing for the new year with resolutions, new aspirations and new life. It comes as a timely reminder that our God takes decisive steps to help us deal with the past, manage the present and live wisely

It is my hope that our Anglican Church will be at the forefront in this mission during the coming year, being guided under the theme of

"Mission 2020: God's Gathering" as we move from St. Lucy to Christ Church and climax in St. Michael.

As we celebrate this Christmastide and enter the new decade, may God's Holy Spirit empower us to spread His love to everyone and extend His welcome to many others as He gathers His citizens Home. May this Christmas be the initial spark to reignite God's gathering.


