The Gospel presents **the story of the birth of Jesus**. He is born amid very humble human circumstances. A government registration programme requires Joseph and Mary to go to Bethlehem, the city of David. Because there was no other place for them to stay, Mary lays her new son in a stable manger. An angel then appears to shepherds and announces the joyful news of the Saviour’s birth.

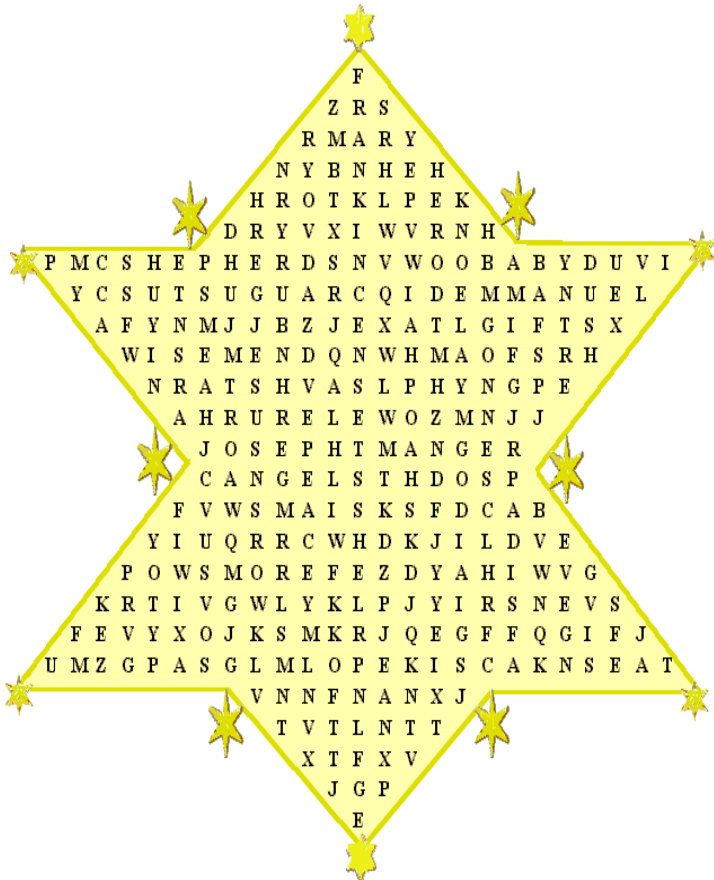


