### The Sixth Sunday after The Epiphany

First Reading: Deuteronomy 30:15-20

Comment: "Choose life"

In the Hebrew scripture lesson Moses presents the people with their choice: love and obey the Lord and find life, or turn away to other gods and know death. Israel is about to cross over into the promised land, and this is Moses' final charge to them. In historical terms the speech was probably composed many hundreds of years later, near the time of the exile, after Israel had experienced much backsliding from the Lord. But this is still their choice: blessing or curse – life and good, or death and evil.

#### Psalm 119:1-8

The psalmist takes great delight in the Lord's statutes and seeks to keep all God's commandments.

SECOND READING (The Epistle): 1 Corinthians 3:1-9 Comment "God gives the growth"

In this lesson Paul admonishes the Corinthians for their bickering and divisions. Missionaries like Paul and Apollos are not to be regarded as leaders of separate sects. They are coworkers in the Lord's field, while it is God who supplies the growth. To think otherwise is immature and is based on worldly rather than spiritual understandings.

**THE HOLY GOSPEL:** Matthew 5:21-37

Comment: "The teaching of Christ: forgiveness"

In our Gospel we hear of Jesus' concern with the heart of human behaviour. Discipleship means far more than observances of the outward forms of the law. Genuinely to fulfil the commandments not to kill, not to commit adultery, and not to swear falsely requires a transformation of one's life. One must be willing to cast away any part of the self which opposes this change of mind and heart.
