14 But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them: 'Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. ³⁶Therefore let the entire house of Israel know with certainty that God has made him both Lord and Messiah, this Jesus whom you crucified.'

The First Converts

37 Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and to the other apostles, 'Brothers, what should we do?' ³⁸Peter said to them, 'Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. ³⁹For the promise is for you, for your children, and for all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to him.' ⁴⁰And he testified with many other arguments and exhorted them, saying, 'Save yourselves from this corrupt generation.' ⁴¹So those who welcomed his message were baptized, and that day about three thousand persons were added.

Second Lesson: Luke 24:13-35 "The Walk to Emmaus"

13 Now on that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem, ¹⁴and talking with each other about all these things that had happened. ¹⁵While they were talking and discussing, Jesus himself came near and went with them, ¹⁶but their eyes were

kept from recognizing him. 17And he said to them, 'What are you discussing with each other while you walk along?' They stood still, looking sad. ¹⁸Then one of them, whose name was Cleopas, answered him, 'Are you the only stranger in Jerusalem who does not know the things that have taken place there in these days?' 19He asked them, 'What things?' They replied, 'The things about Jesus of Nazareth, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, ²⁰ and how our chief priests and leaders handed him over to be condemned to death and crucified him. 21 But we had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel. Yes, and besides all this, it is now the third day since these things took place. ²²Moreover, some women of our group astounded us. They were at the tomb early this morning, ²³ and when they did not find his body there, they came back and told us that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who said that he was alive. ²⁴Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said; but they did not see him.' 25Then he said to them, 'Oh, how foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have declared! ²⁶Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and then enter into his glory?' ²⁷Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them the things about himself in all the scriptures. 28 As they came near the village to which they were going, he walked ahead as if he were going on. ²⁹But they urged him strongly, saying, 'Stay with us, because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over.' So he went in to stay with them. 30When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. ³¹Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. 32They said to each other, 'Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?' 33That same hour they got up and returned to Jerusalem; and they found the eleven and their companions gathered together. 34They were saying, 'The Lord has risen indeed, and he has appeared to Simon!' ³⁵Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread.

The Third Sunday of Easter YEAR A

First Lesson: Acts 2:14a, 36-41

Comments ~ "Receiving God's promise through baptism"

This reading is a summary of the preaching and other activities of the early Christian community in Jerusalem. The crucified one, Jesus, has been made Lord and Christ. Now is the time for repentance, forgiveness, and the gift of the Spirit. There are many signs and healings as the church grows. The new disciples share fully with one another and meet for teaching, eucharistic meals and prayers.

Psalm 116:1-3, 10-17

An offering of thanksgiving ang praise by one who has been rescued from death.

Second Lesson: 1 Peter 1:17-23

Comments ~ "Born anew"

In this lesson we hear that the price of Christian freedom from the old ways of futility has been paid with the sacrificial blood of Christ. Although now we await the judgement of God the Father in awe, we have the faith and hope of people who have been born anew. The letter from which this passage comes was addressed to former pagans, and may first have been read at an Easter baptismal service. Having been purified by Christ's imperishable offering, disciples are now to love one another from the heart.

The Holy Gospel: Luke 24:13-35

Comments ~ "Eating with the risen Christ"

Our Gospel is the story of how two disciples were met by a stranger on the road to Emmaus. That evening, as he breaks bread with them, they know the stranger to be Jesus. While they are walking together, Jesus interprets the scriptures to them, showing that it was necessary that Christ should suffer. Later he disappears from their sight. While their Lord is no longer physically present, the church now knows that Jesus will disclose himself in scripture and the breaking of bread, and sometimes through a stranger.

CATHEDRAL NEWS

 The Cathedral Church is now fully closed further to the recent announcement of emergency measures by The Attorney General, The Honourable Dale Marshall, Q.C., M.P., due to Barbados being at Stage 3 of the Coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic which restricts all Churches from opening.

- 2. Confirmation Classes: Please note that registration for Confirmation Classes has started. It is anticipated that Confirmation will be celebrated in November, as part of the Diocese's "Mission 2020: God's Gathering" initiative. Completed forms should be returned to the Office as soon as health conditions in the country make that possible.
- 3. **Household Worship:** The cathedral is closed to public worship; however, members are encouraged to pray the office of Morning Prayer at the regular Sunday service times, 7:00 A.M. and 9:00 A.M., or at a time convenient to the family. The Daily Office can also serve as a personal or family discipline. The Daily Lectionary for Week of Second Easter begins on page 748, in the Book of Common Prayer. Note further that this year is Year 2, and the readings for Monday, April 27th, 2020 are Exodus 18:13-27; Psalms 9 & 15; and Matthew 1:1-17, 3:1-6.
- 4. Stewardship of Treasure: During this period when the congregation is not assembling for corporate worship, I appeal to everyone to fulfil their individual financial commitments to God, in the mission of the Cathedral. By the regular use of the envelopes which have been issued. I further encourage members to make your contributions in any of the following ways:
 - Bring the offering to the Cathedral and lodge it with the Administrative Assistant at the Office on Tuesdays and Thursdays between the hours of 9:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. and Fridays from 10:00 A.M. to 2:00 P.M.

- ii. Write a cheque to St. Michael's Cathedral, place it in the regular offering envelope and then in another envelope addressed to The Dean, St. Michael's Cathedral, Bridgetown, St. Michael for mailing purposes.
- iii. Make an online payment to the St. Michael's Cathedral, CIBC First Caribbean International Bank, Bridgetown Branch, Account # 27193-02.
- iv. If none of these three arrangements is convenient, I ask that the offering be set aside, either weekly or monthly, as one would normally present it, and that the entire package be ready when corporate worship resumes.
- 5. Ministry Today: During this period of the closure of the regular operations of the Cathedral, please note that the ministry of Christ continues. The following basic ministries will be sustained during this period: Administration (Human Resources, Financial and Property management); Christian Education (Bible study, etc.); Pastoral Services (Prayer, Counsel and Bereavement Support); Social Outreach (Deacon's Cupboard, SMCFA); and Worship (Streaming of services, Family worship, Daily Devotion).
- 6. Bereavements: Sincere condolences are extended to the families of the late Mrs. C. Daphne Howard (member of the Church Army, Mothers' Union and Woman's Auxiliary) and Mr. Clifford Nurse (member of the Men's Fellowship). May they rest in peace; and the families experience the blessedness of those who mourn.

Earth Day in the Coronavirus era

On the eve of Earth Day (22 April), the Environmental Coordinator for the Anglican Church of southern Africa, the Rev'd Canon Rachel Mash, considers the effects of the global Covid-19 closedown on the environment.

Fifty years ago on the first Earth Day, 20 million Americans took to the streets, to demonstrate against oil spills, air pollution and the extinction of wildlife. Fifty years later and more than two billion people globally are in lock down. What is the meaning of Earth day for us, faced with the Coronavirus?

Firstly: the Coronavirus is not a natural disaster, it is an ecological disaster. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the US national public health institute, estimates that three-quarters of the "new or emerging" diseases that infect human beings originated in wild or domesticated animals.

Ebola, swine flu, avian flu and mad cow disease were all warning calls. The more we use unhealthy animal agricultural practices and encroach on the natural ecosystem, the more frequent such diseases will become. The World Wildlife Fund says that pandemics are the boomerang effect of destruction of eco-systems.

Secondly: in the words of Pope Francis we share one common home. We are realising the we are part of a web of life. Coronavirus teaches us that our safety depends on the

actions of others just as climate change shows us that the future of the whole Earth depends on actions of all nations. Whatever befalls the earth befalls the sons and daughters of Earth.

Thirdly: change is possible. We have seen unprecedented change in lifestyles, transport, and debt relief for the poor. The Earth is breathing and the skies are blue. We have rediscovered the value of silence and the treasure of creation.

The world we go back to could be different, it is a chance to reset our values and priorities. Our economy, our society and our relationship with nature – these are all things we have been made to think differently about. We need to bail out people, not polluters. We need to honour our farm workers and treasure and protect the precious soil of life.

Two years after the first Earth day the Clean Air Act, the Clean Water Act and the Endangered Species Act had been passed.

Change is possible. Let us dream and work towards a new earth. This Earth day let us commit to renewing the face of the Earth.
