First Lesson: Acts 3:12-19

¹²When Peter saw it, he addressed the people, 'You Israelites, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we had made him walk? ¹³The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our ancestors has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and rejected in the presence of Pilate, though he had decided to release him. ¹⁴But you rejected the Holy and Righteous One and asked to have a murderer given to you, ¹⁵ and you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses. ¹⁶And by faith in his name, his name itself has made this man strong, whom you see and know; and the faith that is through Jesus has given him this perfect health in the presence of all of you. 17 'And now, friends, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did also your rulers. ¹⁸In this way God fulfilled what he had foretold the prophets, that his Messiah would through all suffer. ¹⁹Repent therefore, and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out.

Second Lesson: 1 John 3:1-7

3¹See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. ²Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. ³And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

⁴ Everyone who commits sin is guilty of lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. ⁵You know that he was revealed to take away sins, and in him there is no sin. ⁶No one who abides in him sins; no one who sins has either seen him or known him. ⁷Little children, let no one deceive you. Everyone who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous.

Benedictus Luke 1:68-79

Blessed are you, Lord the God of Israel;

You have come to your people and set them free.

You have raised up for us a mighty Saviour, born of the house of your servant David.

Through your holy prophets

The Holy Gospel Luke 24:36b-48

36 While they were talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you.' ³⁷They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. ³⁸He said to them, 'Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? ³⁹Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have.' ⁴⁰And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. ⁴¹While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' ⁴²They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³ and he took it and ate in their presence. 44 Then he said to them, 'These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled.' ⁴⁵Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, ⁴⁶ and he said to them, 'Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the

dead on the third day, ⁴⁷and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. ⁴⁸You are witnesses of these things.

The Third Sunday of Easter YEAR B

First Lesson: Acts 3:12-19

Comments ~ "Health and forgiveness through the risen Jesus"

Peter has just healed a crippled man, and in this passage, he proclaims the fundamentals of the gospel to those who come running to hear him. From the beginning the new faith showed its powers through such healing, and these occasions were used for preaching the good news. Many of these speeches are presented as summaries of basic themes. The role of the apostles as witnesses to Jesus' resurrection is stressed, as is the theme of spiritual fulfillment.

Psalm 4

The prayer of one falsely accused, and an expression of confidence in God, who instills confidence and peace in all circumstances.

Second Lesson: 1 John 3:1-7

Comments ~ "The revealing of the children of God" In this lesson we learn that through the Father's love, disciples are now children of God, and they no longer live in sin. Their destiny is to be like Christ. Those who live without God do not understand what it means to be a child of God any more than they recognised Jesus. But Christians know that a dramatic change has taken place in their lives, and that the mystery of what they are fully to become still awaits them.

The Holy Gospel: Luke 24: 36b-48

Comments ~ "Eating with the risen Christ"

In our gospel the risen Jesus shows himself again to his disciples, and he interprets to them the scriptures which reveal that his death and resurrection were part of God's plan. This Jesus is no ghost or phantom (as some later interpretations of the resurrection might have suggested). His appearance is real; his friends touch him and he eats with them. Now they are to be witnesses and to carry the message of repentance and forgiveness to all peoples.

CATHEDRAL NEWS

- 1. The Cathedral Church is now closed due to Barbados being affected by the volcanic ash from the La Soufriere Volcano. The removal of ash and the cleaning of the premise will continue during the course of this week.
- 2. Household Worship: Public worship is permissible in accordance with the provision of the EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT (COVID-19) (No. 8) Directive 2021. Worshippers are to be seated six feet apart in all directions. Meantime, members are encouraged to worship virtually or to pray the office of Morning Prayer at the regular Sunday service

times, 7:00 A.M. and 9:00 A.M., or at a time convenient to the family. The Daily Office can also serve as a personal or family discipline. The Daily Lectionary for the Third Week of Easter begins on page 748, in the Book of Common Prayer. Note further that this year is Year 1, and the readings for Monday, April 19th, 2021 are, Exodus 18:13-27 Psalms 9 &15, and Matthew 3:1-6.
