The Coming of the Holy Spirit

2When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. ²And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³Divided tongues, as of fire,

appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

⁵ Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. ⁶And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. ⁷Amazed and astonished, they asked, ‘Are not all these who are speaking Galileans?’ ⁸And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? ⁹Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, ¹¹Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God’s deeds of power.’ ¹²All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, ‘What does this mean?’ ¹³But others sneered and said, ‘They are filled with new wine.’

The Day of Pentecost

First Reading: Acts 2:1-21

Comment: *“Filled with the Spirit to tell God’s deeds”*

This lesson tells **the story of the Holy Spirit filling the apostles and empowering them to share the message of the gospel with people of different languages.** Clearly this was a most dramatic moment in the life of the early church, an experience described in terms of wind and fire. From this time forward the mighty works of God done in Jesus will be told to all the peoples of the earth, crossing barriers of language and culture.

Psalm 104:25-35, 37

The psalm describes the wonders of the world created and renewed by the Lord’s Spirit.

Second Reading (**The Epistle**): Romans 8:22-27

Comment: *“Praying with the Spirit”*

In this New Testament reading, **the apostle Paul understands the whole of creation to be linked with human destiny as we await our redemption.** We await our adoption in hope, dependent on the indwelling Spirit of God, who intercedes for us in all things in ways we cannot achieve for ourselves.

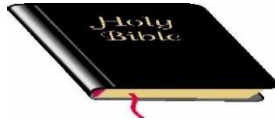
The Holy Gospel: John 15:26-27; 16:4b-15

Comment: *“Christ sends the Spirit of truth”*

In our gospel, **Jesus tells his disciples that his going away will mean the coming of the Advocate, the Holy Spirit who will guide them into all truth.** The Counselor-Spirit will bring true judgement into the world. Everything the Spirit declares will have been received from Jesus, even as all which the Father has belongs to Jesus. The Spirit, then, reveals Jesus who himself has made the Father known.

The Daily Office can also serve as a personal or family discipline. The Daily Lectionary for the Week of Pentecost, Proper 3, begins on page 759, in the Book of Common Prayer. Note further that this year is Year 1, and the readings for Monday, May 24th, 2021 are Deuteronomy 4:9-14, Psalm 25, and 2 Corinthians 1:1-11.
