A reading from the Word of God written in the Letter of James, chapter 3 verse 13 to chapter 4: verses 3, 7-8a.

Who is wise and understanding among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be boastful and false to the truth. Such wisdom does not come down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for those who make peace.

Those conflicts and disputes among you, where do they come from? Do they not come from your cravings that are at war within you? You want something and do not have it; so you commit murder. And you covet something and cannot obtain it; so you engage in disputes and conflicts. You do not have, because you do not ask. The Seventeenth Sunday after Pentecost

First Reading: Jeremiah 11:18-20

Comment: "The prophet led like a lamb to slaughter" In this reading, the prophet Jeremiah offers the first of his laments to the Lord. Though he is innocent, there are those who seek to take his life because of his faithful outspokenness. Yet his confidence is placed firmly in God to whom he has committed his cause.

Psalm 54

A prayer of salvation by one who is persecuted.

Second Reading (The Epistle): James 3:13—4:3, 7-8a

Comment: "The wisdom from above"

In this New Testament epistle, believers are to cleave to wisdom that is pure, peaceable, gentle, and full of mercy and good fruits. The Christian community must recognise the results of worldly attitudes and desires: jealousy, disorder, quarrels, even murder. Prayers are too often offered for the wrong motives, but a harvest of righteousness is sown for those who sow in peace. The wise will refuse evil and draw near to God, and in doing so, they will find that God has also drawn near to them.

The Holy Gospel: Mark 9:30-37

Comment: "Prediction of the passion"

In the gospel, Jesus foretells his death and resurrection as the Son of Man, bidding his disciples to have a servant ministry and to learn to welcome him and God in a child. The several sayings are linked together by the theme of Jesus' lowliness and readiness to suffer for others. His followers' difficulty in understanding him and their discussion concerning which of them is greatest stand in sharp contrast to their Lord's teachings. Jesus' action and words with regard to the child remind us of another saying: whatever is done to the least member of the community is done to him.
