A reading from the Word of God written in the Book of Isaiah, chapter 53, verses 4 to 12.

Surely he has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases; yet we accounted him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted. A reading from the Word of God written in the Letter to the Hebrews, chapter 5, verses 1 to 10.

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not presume to take this honor, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was.

So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him,

> "You are my Son, today I have begotten you"; as he says also in another place,

"You are a priest forever,

according to the order of Melchizedek."

In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

The Twenty-First Sunday after Pentecost

First Reading: Isaiah 53:4-12

Comment: "The suffering servant"

Our opening lesson is the poem of the Lord's servant who suffers and bears the sins of many. The passage is part of the fourth and last of the "servant songs" which form a portion of the Book of Isaiah written when the exile was coming to an end. The servant is sometimes thought to be an historical individual or an idealisation of the faithful of Israel. This "man of sorrows," despised and rejected," "wounded for our transgressions," whom the Lord at last vindicates, is perceived by Christians to be a prefigurement of Jesus.

Psalm 91:9-16

A hymn of trust in the Lord. God will guard and deliver the one who loves and seeks refuge with God.

Second Reading (The Epistle): Hebrews 5:1-10

Comment: "Through suffering Christ becomes the source of salvation"

In this New Testament lesson, we hear how **through obedience and suffering, Christ reached the perfection of his destiny and was designated by God to be the eternal high priest.** The high priesthood of Jesus is the great theme of the Letter to the Hebrews. Like the high priests of the old covenant, Christ is chosen from among human beings and so has sympathy with human weakness. But he is the Son and has now been named high priest forever. He succeeds Melchizedek, a royal and priestly figure from antiquity, and has been made the source of salvation for all who trust in him.

The Holy Gospel: Mark 10:35-45

Comment: "Warnings to ambitious disciples"

In the gospel story, Jesus' followers still expect that his way will quickly lead to a state of glory in which they want special places. Jesus tells them of a different path of discipleship. First Jesus and then his disciples must experience the cup of sorrow and the baptism of death. They are not to live and act like worldly rulers. They must lead in servanthood. Their example is Jesus, who as the Son of Man serves and gives his life.
