First Lesson: Genesis 28:10-17

Lector: Mr. Darwin Clarke

A reading from the Word of God written in the Book of Genesis, chapter 28, verses 10 to 17.

Jacob left Beer-sheba and went toward Haran. He came to a certain place and stayed there for the night, because the sun had set. Taking one of the stones of the place, he put it under his head and lay down in that place. First Reading: Genesis 28:10-17

Comment: *“Jacob’s Dream”*

God comes to Jacob in a dream and, in a vision of a ladder between earth and heaven, renews with Jacob the promise made to his grandfather Abraham. Jacob will become the father of a great nation. Jacob awakes astonished at God’s self-revelation and sets up a sacred pillar, calling the place “Bethel,” a site which will one day become an important northern shrine city.

Psalm 103:19-22

A hymn of praise for God’s salvation of Israel.

Second Reading (**The Epistle**): Revelation 12:7-12

Comment: *“Michael defeats Satan in a cosmic battle”*

In a picture of war in heaven between the Dragon, the Ancient Serpent, the Devil, Satan – all names which describe the one evil being – and Michael and all his angels. There is a description of the expulsion of the fallen angels from heaven, or it may be an echo of an old myth of the storming of heaven by the Titans. Whatever the origin, the writer gives a definite Christian interpretation to the ancient legend.

The Holy Gospel: John 1:47-51

Comment: *“The mediator between heaven and earth”*

Our Gospel is the story of Philip and Nathaniel becoming disciples of Jesus. Nathaniel first doubts that the one whom

Moses foretold could come from the virtually unknown town of Nazareth. But Jesus astounds Nathaniel by telling him what normal sight could not have disclosed. He then promises Nathaniel that he will have his own still greater vision, a heavenly revelation of the Son of Man as an intermediary between heaven and earth.
