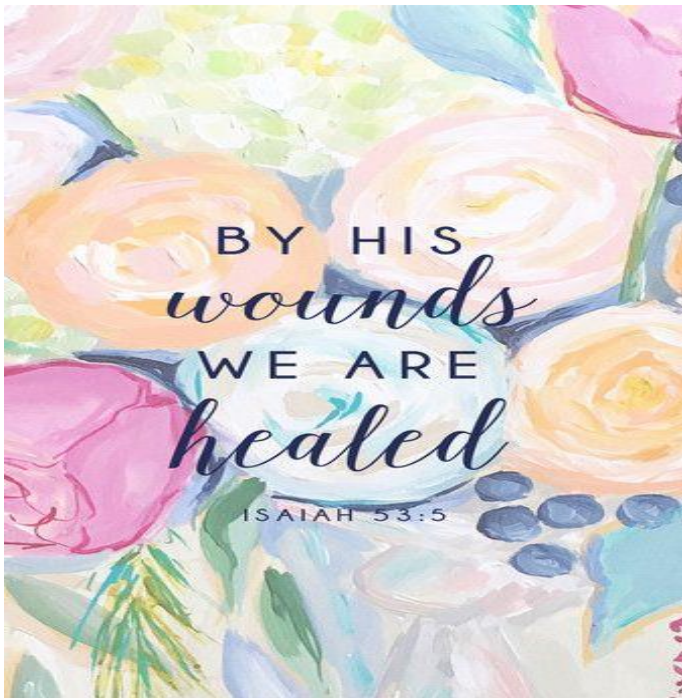

**THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD**

First Lesson: Acts 11:1-18

LECTOR: Ms. Alicia White

A Reading from the Word of God, written in the Acts of the Apostles, the eleventh chapter, beginning at the first verse.

Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, saying, "Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?" Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, 'Get up, Peter; kill and eat.' But I replied, 'By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' But a second time the voice answered from heaven, 'What God has made clean, you must not call profane.' This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.' And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?" When they heard this, they



were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life.

## THE FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER ~ YEAR C

### **First Reading: Acts 11:1-18**

**Comment: “Peter’s vision: God gives the Gentiles repentance that leads to life.”**

In this reading from the story of the early church, **followers of Jesus living in Judea and Jerusalem are astonished to learn of the conversion of Gentiles as Peter tells them of his heavenly vision and how the Holy Spirit fell upon the new believers.** The vision helped Peter understand that the observance of food laws and the like was not essential for discipleship.

### **Psalm 148**

The whole of creation and all peoples join together in praise of the Lord.

### **Second Reading: Revelations 21:1-6**

**Comment: “New heaven, new earth, springs of living water in the new Jerusalem.”**

In this lesson, John the Seer has a **vision of the renewal of all creation and of the new Jerusalem as the city in which God will abide with redeemed humanity.** The old order has passed away and death is no more, neither pain nor the causes of distress and sadness. Christ is victory, the Alpha and Omega, promises living water to any who thirst.

## **The Holy Gospel: John 13:31-35**

**Comment: “Jesus gives a new commandment: love one another as I have loved you.”**

In our gospel lesson, **Jesus speaks to his disciples on the night that he is to be betrayed and handed over to death.** Yet his dying as the Son of Man will also be the way that God is glorified—both because of Jesus’ sacrifice on behalf of others and because of his resurrection and victory over the power of death. Jesus’ disciples will now be known by their following of his new commandment—that they love one another with the same sacrificial love he has shown them.
