

THE TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST YEAR C

THEME FOR THE WEEK

God's absolute forgiveness always seems to surprise us.

First Reading: Habakkuk 1:1-4; 2:1-4

Comment: "A Prayer and Cry for Justice"

In our first reading, the prophet bitterly complains to the Lord about the injustice and violence in the world. God answers that justice will come in time; meanwhile, the righteous will live by faithfulness and loyalty. It is the time of Chaldean (or Babylonian) invasion. Habakkuk cannot understand how God can allow all this evil and destruction. He takes his position in the watchtower to await the Lord's reply. Those who are right with God will continue to live by their trust in God.

Psalm 119:137-144

Page 637

The psalmist acknowledges God as the source of all truth and righteousness and prays for understanding.

Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 1:1-4, 11-12

Comment: "Faith and love amid persecution and adversity."

Together with Silvanus and Timothy, Paul greets the new disciples on Thessalonica. He offers thanks to God for the increase of their faith under persecution and assures them of his prayers. Paul is so proud of their growing faith and love that he boasts about them to others. He suggests that their present troubles may be Gods way of proving them worthy of the reign of God.

The Holy Gospel: Luke 19:1-10

Comment: "Zacchaeus climbs into a tree to see Jesus"

In the gospel, Jesus answers a question concerning the chief command of the law by reciting the double commandant to love God and one's neighbour. Jesus was not unique in bringing together these two great teachings from Ismael's heritage, but the New Testament gives them special emphasis. They are closely linked, for in responding to God's love, we learn that we are lovable, and so begin to be able to love others as ourselves. In loving our neighbours we discover the mystery that we are also loving in them, their Creator. The man who asked Jesus the question repeats the commandments in his own words. He is not far from the kingdom
