

THE HOLY NAME OF OUR LORD

THEME FOR THE WEEK

"There is power in the name of Jesus"

First Reading: Numbers 6:22-27

Comment – "The form of blessing the children of Israel, to be used by Aaron and his sons,"

In our opening lesson, Moses, by God's command, instructs those set aside for priestly ministry to bless Israel, putting God's own name upon them. These words have come to be known as the "Aaronic blessing," as they were first entrusted to Aaron and his sons, because there is a threefold form to the blessing. Christians have often here perceived intimations of faith in the triune God.

Psalm 8

Comment: "God is to be glorified, for making known himself to us."

The psalmist glorifies the name of the Lord, sovereign of the earth and the magnificent heavens, who has made human life to have mastery over all other earthly creatures.

Second Reading: Galatians 4:4-7

Comment: "Our adoption into God's family."

In the fullness of time, God sent God's own Son, born under the law, to redeem those under the law and to give them a new status as adopted children. Christians are not to see themselves as God's slaves, but as children and heirs to whom the spirit has come, enabling them to speak to God in intimate terms, crying "Abba! Father!"

The Holy Gospel: Luke 2:15-21

Comment: "His name was called Jesus"

Our gospel tells how the shepherds, after the angelic vision which announced the Saviour's birth, come to Bethlehem to see for themselves the child who is to be named Jesus. They share with Mary and Joseph the words of the angels. In this little infant, laid in a manger, the shepherds perceived the fulfillment of the song of the heavenly hosts. After eight days, in accordance with the law, the baby is then circumcised and given the promised name.
