

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

First Lesson: 1 Samuel 16:1-13

A Reading from the Word of God, written in the First Book of Samuel, the sixteenth chapter, beginning at the first verse.

The LORD said to Samuel, "How long will you grieve over Saul? I have rejected him from being king over Israel. Fill your horn with oil and set out; I will send you to Jesse the Bethlehemite, for I have provided for myself a king among his sons." Samuel said, "How can I go? If Saul hears of it, he will kill me." And the LORD said, "Take a heifer with you, and say, 'I have come to sacrifice to the LORD.' Invite Jesse to the sacrifice, and I will show you what you shall do; and you shall anoint for me the one whom I name to you." Samuel did what the LORD commanded, and came to Bethlehem. The elders of the city came to meet him trembling, and said, "Do you come peaceably?" He said, "Peaceably; I have come to sacrifice to the LORD; sanctify yourselves and come with me to the sacrifice." And he sanctified Jesse and his sons and invited them to the sacrifice.

When they came, he looked on Eliab and thought, "Surely the Lord's anointed is now before the LORD." But the LORD said to Samuel, "Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him; for the LORD does not see as mortals see; they look on the outward appearance, but the LORD looks on the heart." Then Jesse called Abinadab, and made him pass before Samuel. He said, "Neither has the LORD chosen this one." Then Jesse made Shammah pass by. And he said, "Neither has the LORD chosen this one." Jesse made seven of his sons pass before Samuel, and Samuel said to Jesse, "The LORD has not chosen any of these." Samuel said to Jesse, "Are all your sons here?" And he said, "There remains yet the youngest, but he is keeping the sheep." And Samuel said to Jesse, "Send and bring him; for we will not sit down until he comes here." He sent and brought him in. Now he was ruddy, and had beautiful eyes, and was handsome. The LORD said, "Rise and anoint him; for this is the one." Then Samuel took the horn of oil, and anointed him in the presence of his brothers; and the spirit of the LORD came mightily upon David from that day forward. Samuel then set out and went to Ramah.

The Holy Gospel: John 9:1-41

GOSPELLER: (To be narrated)

The Gospeller: The Lord be with you. **ALL: And also with you.**

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to John, the ninth chapter, beginning at the first verse.

ALL: Glory to Christ our Saviour.

Narrator: As Jesus walked along, he saw a man blind from birth. His disciples asked him,

Disciples: "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?"

Narrator: Jesus answered,

Jesus: "Neither this man nor his parents sinned; he was born blind so that God's works might be revealed in him. We must work the works of him who

sent me while it is day; night is coming when no one can work. As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world."

Narrator: When he had said this, he spat on the ground and made mud with the saliva and spread the mud on the man's eyes, saying to him,

Jesus: "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam"

Narrator: (which means Sent). Then he went and washed and came back able to see. The neighbours and those who had seen him before as a beggar began to ask,

Neighbours: "Is this not the man who used to sit and beg?"

Narrator: Some were saying,

Neighbours: "It is he."

Narrator: Others were saying,

Neighbours: "No, but it is someone like him."

Narrator: He kept saying,

Man Born Blind: "I am the man."

Narrator: But they kept asking him,

Neighbours: "Then how were your eyes opened?"

Narrator: He answered,

Man Born Blind: "The man called Jesus made mud, spread it on my eyes, and said to me, 'Go to Siloam and wash.' Then I went and washed and received my sight."

Narrator: They said to him,

Neighbours: "Where is he?"

Narrator: He said,

Man Born Blind: "I do not know."

Narrator: They brought to the Pharisees the man who had formerly been blind. Now it was a sabbath day when Jesus made the mud and opened his eyes. Then the Pharisees also began to ask him how he had received his sight. He said to them,

Man Born Blind: "He put mud on my eyes. Then I washed, and now I see."

Narrator: Some of the Pharisees said,

Pharisees: "This man is not from God, for he does not observe the sabbath."

Narrator: But others said,

Pharisees: "How can a man who is a sinner perform such signs?"

Narrator: And they were divided. So they said again to the blind man,

Pharisees: "What do you say about him? It was your eyes he opened."

Narrator: He said,

Man Born Blind: "He is a prophet."

Narrator: The Jews did not believe that he had been blind and had received his sight until they called the parents of the man who had received his sight and asked them,

Jews: "Is this your son, who you say was born blind? How then does he now see?"

Narrator: His parents answered,

Parents: "We know that this is our son, and that he was born blind; but we do not know how it is that now he sees, nor do we know who opened his eyes. Ask him; he is of age. He will speak for himself."

Narrator: His parents said this because they were afraid of the Jews; for the Jews had already agreed that anyone who confessed Jesus to be the Messiah would be put out of the synagogue. Therefore his parents said,

Parents: "He is of age; ask him."

Narrator: So for the second time they called the man who had been blind, and they said to him,

Jews: "Give glory to God! We know that this man is a sinner."

Narrator: He answered,

Man Born Blind: "I do not know whether he is a sinner. One thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see."

Narrator: They said to him,

Jews: "What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?"

Narrator: He answered them,

Man Born Blind: "I have told you already, and you would not listen. Why do you want to hear it again? Do you also want to become his disciples?"

Narrator: Then they reviled him, saying,

Jews: "You are his disciple, but we are disciples of Moses. We know that God has spoken to Moses, but as for this man, we do not know where he comes from."

Narrator: The man answered,

Man Born Blind: "Here is an astonishing thing! You do not know where he comes from, and yet he opened

my eyes. We know that God does not listen to sinners, but he does listen to one who worships him and obeys his will. Never since the world began has it been heard that anyone opened the eyes of a person born blind. If this man were not from God, he could do nothing."

Narrator: They answered him,

Jews: "You were born entirely in sins, and are you trying to teach us?"

Narrator: And they drove him out.

Jesus heard that they had driven him out, and when he found him, he said,

Jesus: "Do you believe in the Son of Man?"

Narrator: He answered,

Man Born Blind: "And who is he, sir? Tell me, so that I may believe in him."

Narrator: Jesus said to him,

Jesus: "You have seen him, and the one speaking with you is he."

Narrator: He said,

Man Born Blind: "Lord, I believe."

Narrator: And he worshiped him. Jesus said,

Jesus: "I came into this world for judgment so that those who do not see may see, and those who do see may become blind."

Narrator: Some of the Pharisees near him heard this and said to him,

Pharisees: "Surely we are not blind, are we?"

Narrator: Jesus said to them,

Jesus: "If you were blind, you would not have sin. But now that you say, 'We see,' your sin remains."

The Nicene Creed

THE FOURTH SUNDAY IN LENT ~ YEAR A

THEME FOR THE WEEK

"Through our Lenten penances, we move from the darkness of our old ways to the light of Jesus' way."

First Reading: 1 Samuel 16:1-13

Comment: "David is chosen and anointed"

In this Hebrew scripture story, **the Lord sends Samuel to anoint David to be the new king over Israel.** God has rejected Saul as king, but he remains in power and Samuel must go secretly on his mission. As so often happens in the Bible, one who seems least likely in the eyes of others is chosen by God to carry out the divine will.

Psalm 23

Comment: "You anointed my head with oil"

The Lord is shepherd and guide. God is present in the time of danger and is generous and merciful.

Second Reading: Ephesians 5:8-14

Comment: "Awake from sleep, live as children of light."

In this New Testament lesson, **disciples are called** to be a people of the light, forsaking all the works of darkness. Their present life is to be in sharp contrast with their actions before they become Christians. All that is done is to be exposed to the light. The passage closes with what was probably part of an ancient hymn used at baptisms.

The Holy Gospel: John 9:1-41

Comment: "Baptismal image: the man born blind"

Our gospel is **the story of Jesus' healing of a man born blind. Jesus brings light into a dark world.** Many people of the time regarded the man's blindness to be a result of sin, but Jesus helps him to see, at first physically, and then spiritually as well. The man withstands the criticism of the religious officials and worships Jesus as the Son of Man and his Lord.
