Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, "Athenians, I see how extremely religious you are in every way. For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, 'To an unknown god.' What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things. From one ancestor he made all nations to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, so that they would search for God and perhaps grope for him and find him—though indeed he is not far from each one of us. For 'In him we live and move and have our being'; as even some of your own poets have said,

'For we too are his offspring.'

Since we are God's offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like gold, or silver, or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of mortals. While God has overlooked the times of human ignorance, now he commands all people everywhere to repent, because he has fixed a day on which he will have the world judged in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed, and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead."

A reading from the Word of God written in the First Letter of Peter, the third chapter, beginning at the thirteenth verse.

Now who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good? But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and reverence. Keep your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who abuse you for your good conduct in Christ may be put to shame. For it is better to suffer for doing good, if suffering should be God's will, than to suffer for doing evil. For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water. And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you-- not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him..

SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER – YEAR A THEME FOR THE WEEK

"God's loving care for us requires our intimate attachment to the goals of His mission."



First Reading: Acts 17:22-31

Comment: "Paul's message to the Athenians"

This lesson is **Paul's address in a public forum to the curious citizens of Athens.** The apostle has arrived in the intellectual and cultural center of the Greek world. The author of Acts has him deliver a kind of sample sermon for a pagan audience. Troubled by their worship of many gods, Paul uses their altar dedicated to an unknown god as an opportunity to tell them of the one true Lord of heaven and earth, and of the time of judgement and the man he raised from the dead.

Psalm 66:7-18

Comment: "Bless our God, you peoples: let the sound of praise be heard."

A hymn of praise and thanksgiving to God, who rules in majesty and delivers the people.

Second Reading (The Epistle): 1 Peter 3:13-22

Comment: "The days of Noah, a sign of baptism."

This lesson offers guidance for all Christians, counseling a readiness to suffer patiently for doing what is right. The First Letter of Peter was written at a time when Christians in Asia Minor were experiencing persecution. The author has given advice to particular groups of people and now urges all disciples to live together in love and humility, always being willing to speak in defense of their Christian hope. They should keep their consciences clear, and, if they do suffer, they are to remember how Christ, the just one, died for the unjust.

The Holy Gospel: John 14:15-21

Comment: "Christ our advocate."

In our gospel, Jesus promises his followers that those who love him will be guided by the Holy Spirit and will also see him. The evangelist presents Jesus in final conversation with his followers. Soon he will be taken away from them by death, but God will send another Counselor. The world (that is, Godless society) cannot receive this Spirit of truth nor come to perceive Jesus as still living. Yet those who follow the commandments of love will find new life in intimate association with Jesus and the father.



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Images of Easter: The Lamb

Reflection by The Very Rev'd Dr. Jeffrey Gibson

Another image of the Easter celebration is the lamb; in fact, Easter originates from the Greek/Latin word Pascha or resurrection. (*Mark 14:12-16*)

The festival which celebrates the resurrection of Jesus from the dead is linked to the Jewish Passover since both the crucifixion and the resurrection took place during the Jewish Passover. The Gospels also affirmed Jesus as the Lamb of God. The Apostle Paul, in dealing with the community's discipline, appealed to the believers at

Corinth to live in accordance with a standard befitting the sacrifice which Jesus made for their sins. He used the image of Christ as, "our paschal lamb". "Clean out the old yeast so that you may be a new batch, as you really are unleavened. For our paschal lamb, Christ, has been sacrificed." (1 Cor. 5:7)

Lambs were used in the Jewish faith as a sacrifice for people's sins and wrong doings. The lamb is seen as a sacrificial animal, one that is willing to give its life for the greater good. As such, the lamb can be seen as a symbol of selflessness and sacrifice. Christians readily embrace that image for Jesus and believe that Jesus is the sacrificial lamb for everyone.

Lambs have been associated with springtime and new life since ancient times. This is possible because most lambs are born in the spring around Easter. At Easter, the lamb is a symbol of sacrifice, innocence and vulnerability; and its liveliness, a celebration of new life and hope.
