First Lesson: Deuteronomy 34:1-12

Lector: Mrs. Juno Burrows

A reading from the Word of God written in the Book of Deuteronomy, the thirty-fourth chapter, beginning at the first verse.

Moses went up from the plains of Moab to Mount Nebo, to the top of Pisgah, which is opposite Jericho, and the LORD showed him the whole land: Gilead as far as Dan, all Naphtali, the land of Ephraim and Manasseh, all the land of Judah as far as the Western Sea, the Negeb, and the Plain—that is, the valley of Jericho, the city of palm trees—as far as Zoar. The Lord said to him, "This is the land of which I swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, saying, 'I will give it to your descendants'; I have let you see it with your eyes, but you shall not cross over there." Then Moses, the servant of the Lord, died there in the land of Moab, at the Lord's command. He was buried in a valley in the land of Moab, opposite Beth-peor, but no one knows his burial place to this day. Moses was one hundred twenty years old when he died; his sight was unimpaired and his vigor had not abated. The Israelites wept for Moses in the plains of Moab thirty days; then the period of mourning for Moses was ended. Joshua son of Nun was full of the spirit of wisdom, because Moses had laid his hands on him; and the Israelites obeyed him, doing as the Lord had commanded Moses. Never since has there arisen a prophet in Israel like Moses, whom the Lord knew face to face. He was unequaled for all the signs and wonders that the Lord sent him to perform in the land of Egypt, against Pharaoh and all his servants and his entire land, and for all the mighty deeds and all the terrifying displays of power that Moses performed in the sight of all Israel.

Second Lesson: Matthew 22:34-46

Lector: Mrs. Judy King

A Reading from the Gospel according to Matthew, the twentysecond chapter, beginning at the thirty-fourth verse.

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, and one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" He said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them this question: "What do you think of the Messiah? Whose son is he?" They said to him, "The son of David." He said to them, "How is it then that David by the Spirit calls him Lord, saying,

The Lord said to my Lord, "Sit at my right hand, until I put your enemies under your feet"?

If David thus calls him Lord, how can he be his son?" No one was able to give him an answer, nor from that day did anyone dare to ask him any more questions.

THEME FOR THE WEEK

"Love our neighbour for the sake of Jesus is the greatest commandment of all."

+

First Reading: Deuteronomy 34:1-12

Comment: "Moses has fulfilled his purpose as God's faithful servant"

Our Hebrew scripture lection, recounts **the death of Moses on the very edge of the promised land.** Moses has fulfilled his purpose as God's faithful servant, the one who led the people from their bondage with many sings, received the law, traversed the wilderness, and knew God intimately. From Mount Nebo, Moses surveys the promised land, and then he dies and is buried in Moab. Joshua, upon whom Moses had laid his hands, succeeds him.

Psalm 1

Comment: "Their delight is in the law of the Lord."

The Lord makes fruitful those who choose the way of righteousness.

The Holy Gospel: Matthew 22:34-46

Comment: "Two great commandments: love for God and neighbour."

In the gospel, Jesus presents the double commandment of love for God and neighbour, and then asks a question concerning whose son the Christ is. The content of this passage is the effort by certain Jewish officials to test Jesus, hoping to force him to make an unwise or unpopular comment. Jesus first responds by teaching that all the law and the prophetic words depend for their understanding on commandments of love. He then asks his own question. Using

an argumentative style of the time, Jesus shows how King David (considered to be the author of the Psalms) called the Christ his Lord. Thus, at the very least, the Christ must be more than the son of David. Christians believe this Christ to be Jesus and trust that through him disciples may learn to love both God and neighbour.


