A Reading from the Word of God, written in the book of Genesis, the seventeenth chapter, beginning at the first verse When Abram was ninety-nine years old, he LORD appeared to Abram, and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous." Then Abram fell on his face; and God said to him, "As for me, this is my covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. Second Lesson: Romans 4:13-25 Lectors: 7:00 A.M. ~ Ms. Linda Springer 9:00 A.M. ~ Mrs. Mary Weekes

A Reading from the Word of God, written in the Letter of Paul to the Romans, the fourth chapter, beginning at the thirteenth verse. For the promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation.

For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations")-in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. Hoping against hope, he believed that he would become "the father of many nations," according to what was said, "So numerous shall your descendants be." He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was already as good as dead (for he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb. No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, being fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. Therefore his faith "was reckoned to him as righteousness." Now the words, "it was reckoned to him," were written not for his sake alone, but for ours also. It will be reckoned to us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead, who was handed over to death for our trespasses and was raised for our justification.

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark, the eighth chapter, beginning at the thirty-first verse.

Jesus began to teach his disciples that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. The Second Sunday in Lent: YEAR B THEME FOR THE WEEK

"God's redeeming love blesses our sacrifices for others."



First Reading: Genesis 17:1-7, 15-16 Comment: "God blesses Abraham and Sarah"

In our opening lesson, **God appears to Abram and enters into covenant with him, promising to make him an ancestor to multitudes.** Abram is now a changed person. He will henceforth be called Abraham, and his wife Sarai will now be called Sarah. The covenant is to be an everlasting covenant made not only with Abraham and Sarah, but with all generations which issue from them. The Hebrew people will come to see this covenant as the originating source of their own identity, and Christians will find an example of saving faith in Abraham's response to God's promise.

Psalm 22:22-30

A song of praise to the Lord, who rules over all and cares for the downtrodden.

Second Reading (**The Epistle**): Romans 4:13-25 **Comment:** *"The promise to those who share Abraham's faith"*

In this reading, **Paul explains that the new relationship** with God is open to everyone who follows in Abraham's faith. This means that righteousness before God comes through God's free gift and the response of faith—not because of obedience to the law. This was first true in the case of Abraham, who trusted in God's promise before the law even existed. Now it is true for all who have faith and so show themselves to be among Abraham's descendants from many nations.

The Holy Gospel: Mark 8:31-38 Comment: *"The passion prediction"*

In our gospel passage, Jesus teaches his disciples of the true nature of the ministry of the Son of Man and what it means to follow in his way. Peter has just previously stated his belief that Jesus is the Christ. But now he is called Satan because he tempts Jesus with human ideas rather than God's. Peter needs to understand that, as the Son of Man, Jesus' mission leads through suffering and death before resurrection. Disciples must also learn that the true self and true life are found by those who let themselves be lost for the sake of Jesus and the gospel.



FOR YOUR PERSONAL REFLECTION AND DISCUSSION WITH OTHERS

#1: LEARNING FROM OUR LORD

In the Gospel Reading for The Ash Wednesday Liturgy (Matthew 6:1-6,16-21) we encounter verse 6 which begins "...when you pray...." This says to us that our Lord expects us to pray as was the case with His Disciples. Our Lord was able to say "when you pray" because He Himself understood the value of Prayer.

Let us consider prayer in the life of Our Lord.

1. He made time to pray. Luke Chapter 5:16, states that our Lord Jesus "would withdraw to deserted places and pray." (NRSV) We learn from this verse that Our Lord took time to pray and even moved away from a regular crowd scene. Indeed, we note the instruction given in Matthew 6:6 to go into a secluded place and pray in secret.

Here is an invitation to us to make room for private prayer at regular intervals, go to some quiet place and open ourselves to God in prayer.

Consider following our Lord Jesus and waking up early just to pray or even in the quiet of the night.

Reflect on/Discuss:

- a) Quiet Day. Have you ever been to one? What was your experience?
- b) Are you willing to try one if you have not done so?

c) Should such opportunities be offered by the Church more frequently?

- 2. The Gospel of Mark 14:32-42 gives an account of our Lord at prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane with his disciples wherein he submitted his life totally to God's divine purpose which included being arrested and ultimately crucified.
 - a) It is important to note that in preparation for this gruesome ordeal, Jesus reached out to his Father in prayer.
 - b) He first asked his Father if it were possible for him not to go through this trial, but he left it up to the Father's will, an act of submission. We are therefore encouraged to do likewise, that is, submit our lives totally to God's purpose leaving all our cares in his hands.
 - c) Of equal importance, when he found his disciples sleeping a second time, he encouraged them to keep awake and pray, for the spirit is indeed willing but the flesh is weak. In every testing station of life, we are therefore to keep awake and pray to God for his help because we cannot succeed on our strength.
 - d) It must be recognized that although he went off to pray alone, he was not alone, as his Father was with him. In like manner, when we go off to pray as Jesus did we are also not alone, for God is with us.

Questions for reflection.

- 1) Have you ever had such a trying experience. wherein you submitted everything to God, allowing him to take full control?
- 2) If you have, how does it align with Jesus' submission to his Father's will?
- 3) Based on your personal experience how would you encourage a fellow sister or brother to practice the act of submitting to God?

#2: LEARNING FROM THE LORD'S PRAYER

The Lord's Prayer found in our Bible is termed the 'family' prayer. We learned it as children and we pray it every time we gather in corporate worship, at meetings, at the opening of social functions, even at weddings and funerals. For some of us, it is the first prayer we pray to start each day.

In Luke's gospel the prayer is taught by Jesus, at the request from one of his disciples to teach them to pray. (Luke 11:1-6) The disciples, after seeing their Master constantly at prayer, were alerted to its value. It served to highlight Luke's focus on prayer as the connection to God and to highlight the importance of disciples constantly being in prayer.

The Lord's Prayer is not a 'recitation' and should not be prayed as an act of rote. It teaches us how to speak to God and one should ever be conscious of this fact whenever praying it. Containing seven petitions: four asking for good things—God's name, kingdom, will, provision; and three against evil things—debts, temptation and the evil one. And we note that adoration and honour are given to God first before provision and protection are requested by the prayer. The words of the version noted in the CPWI Book of Common Prayer are not identical to those recorded in Holy Scripture, but their intention and meaning remain true to the originals.

Questions

- **1.** How has this reflection changed your attitude toward the Lord's Prayer?
- 2. How has the pattern of the Lord's Prayer informed your prayer life?
- **3.** What is the vision of the world which Jesus promoted? How can this be achieved?




