The First Sunday of Advent ~ Year C

First Reading: Jeremiah 33:14-16

Comment: "A righteous branch springing up from David" In this prophetic lesson from the Hebrew scriptures, the Lord's promise to the house of Israel and the house of Judah is reaffirmed, foreseeing the arrival of a messianic figure, a righteous branch who will execute justice and save **the people.** This passage may have been added to the Book of Jeremiah a century or so later. A sure confidence in God's deliverance sounds forth, and Christians have interpreted the passage as a prophecy regarding Christ.

Psalm 25:1-9

A prayer for forgiveness and guidance and an expression of trust in the Lord.

Second Reading (The Epistle): 1 Thessalonians 3:9-13

Comment: "Strengthen hearts of holiness for the the coming of the Lord"

In this New Testament reading, **the apostle Paul expresses gratitude to God for his disciples in Thessalonica and tells these followers of his prayers for them.** He has heard a good report of their faith and love and their concern for him. He prays that he will soon see them again, and asks that they may grow in love and be established in holiness, in preparation for the coming of the Lord Jesus.

The Holy Gospel: Luke 21:25-36

Comment: "Be alert for the coming of the Son of Man"

In our gospel lesson, Jesus tells his disciples of the aweinspiring crisis to come, which they may also recognise as the beginning of the time of their redemption. The heavens and earth will bear fearsome witness before the appearance of the heavenly judge, the Son of Man. As the budding fig tree fortells the advance of summer, so can all this calamity be recognised as a preparation for the drawing near of the kingdom of God. The believer is to be alert, fixed on Christ's words and teachings and prepared for the coming of the Lord.
