# The Ministry of the Word

# The First Lesson Acts 16:9-15 Lector: Mrs. Valdine Browne

A reading from the Word of God written in the Acts of the Apostles, the sixteenth chapter, beginning at the ninth verse.

During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them.

We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. A certain woman named Lydia, a worshiper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home." And she prevailed upon us.

# Second Lesson (The Epistle): Revelation 21:10, 22—22:5 Lector: Mr. Darnley King

A reading from the Word of God, written in the Revelation to John, the twenty-first chapter, beginning at the tenth verse.

In the spirit the angel carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God.

I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. Its gates will never be shut by day-- and there will be no night there. People will bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations. But nothing unclean will enter it, nor anyone who practices abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life.

Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. Nothing accursed will be found there any more. But the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him; they will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. And there will be no more night; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever.

#### THE SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

#### YEAR C

First Reading: Acts 16:9-15

**Comment:** "Lydia and her household are baptised by Paul"

In this reading from the story of the early church, Paul and his companions are called by a vision to journey to Macedonia and the city of Philippi, where a merchant named Lydia responds to the gospel and is baptised, together with her household. She offers her home to the travelers, and becomes an important supporter of their missionary endeavour.

#### Psalm 67

A prayer for God's graciousness and saving power, and a bidding of praise by all people for God's justice and bounty.

**Second Lesson (The Epistle): Revelation 21:10, 22-22:5 Comment:** "The Lamb is the light of God's city of God."

In this reading, **John the Seer presents a vision of the new Jerusalem, the paradise of God.** The city has no need of a temple or a sun or moon, for it is enlightened by the very glory of God and the lamp of the Lamb, who is Jesus.
